



MASTER OF SCIENCE IN HOMELAND SECURITY FIVE YEAR PLANNED COURSE ROTATION

The Master of Science Curriculum in Homeland Security includes two options:

Option A – Non Thesis option – 42 total hours to complete the degree with a comprehensive final examination.

Option B – Thesis option – 36 total hours to complete the degree

Undergraduate Preparation: An undergraduate degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, or closely related field. Other undergraduate degrees will be acceptable with the proviso that the student takes HS 5050 Homeland Security in their first semester to familiarize them with the concept of Homeland Security.
